Access to Information Act

Introduction

The purpose of the *Access to Information Act* is to enhance the accountability and transparency of federal institutions in order to promote an open and democratic society and to enable public debate on the conduct of those institutions. In furtherance of that purpose, Part 1 extends the present laws of Canada to provide a right of access to information in records under the control of a government institution in accordance with the principles that government information should be available to the public, that necessary exceptions to the right of access should be limited and specific and that decisions on the disclosure of government information should be reviewed independently of government; and Part 2 sets out requirements for the proactive publication of information.

Section 94 of the *Access to Information Act* requires that the head of federal government institutions prepare and table in Parliament an annual report of the administration of the Act for each fiscal year.

This annual report summarizes the activities of the Asia Pacific Foundation of Canada relating to the *Access to Information Act* between April 1, 2023 and March 31, 2024 and is prepared in accordance with section 94 of the Act.

The Asia Pacific Foundation of Canada

The Asia Pacific Foundation of Canada, created by an Act of Parliament in 1984, is a not-for-profit organization focused on Canada's relations with Asia. Our mission is to be Canada's catalyst for engagement with Asia and Asia's bridge to Canada. APF Canada is dedicated to strengthening ties between Canada and Asia with a focus on expanding economic relations through trade, investment and innovation; promoting Canada's expertise in offering solutions to Asia's climate change, energy, food security and natural resource management challenges; building Asia skills and competencies among Canadians, including young Canadians; and, improving Canadians' general understanding of Asia and its growing global influence.

The Foundation is based in Vancouver, BC and has 37 employees. The Foundation does not have any non-operational ("paper") subsidiaries to report on for this reporting period. Additional information on the Foundation and its activities can be found at www.asiapacific.ca.

Administration of Legislation

The Asia Pacific Foundation of Canada reports to the Minister of Foreign Affairs. The head of the Asia Pacific Foundation is the President and Chief Executive Officer. Operational responsibility for the implementation of the *Access to Information Act* at the Asia Pacific Foundation of Canada has been delegated to the Access to Information and Privacy (ATIP) Coordinator who reports to the Vice-President, Operations and Sponsorship, who in turn reports to the President and CEO. The ATIP Coordinator is the sole staff responsible for ATIP issues, including the collection and publishing of required proactive publication material.

The Foundation did not participate in any service agreements under section 96 of the *Access to Information Act* during the reporting period.

The ATIP Coordinator is responsible for the development and implementation of policies and procedures to manage the Foundation's compliance with the *Access to Information Act*. The ATIP Coordinator is delegated full authority regarding the administration of, and compliance with, the *Access to Information Act*. A copy of the Delegation Order is attached at the end of the report.

Training Activities

During the 2023-24 fiscal year the role and responsibilities of the ATIP Coordinator did not change. The ATIP Coordinator remains the same individual who occupied the position at the end of fiscal year 2022-23 and did not undertake any further ATIP related training.

The ATIP Coordinator did not organize any briefing sessions on the *Access to Information Act* for new staff during the reporting period. (Number of participants: 0). We plan to conduct the appropriate training sessions for staff this Fall 2024, as needed.

The ATIP office has its ATIP information page on the Foundation's Intranet. It provides all employees with several information resources on the legislation, and policies and procedures relating to the *Access to Information Act*.

Policies and Procedures

The Foundation has a comprehensive policies and procedures manual that provides specific procedures, standards and guidelines on processing requests under the *Access to Information Act*. The manual is available to all staff on the Foundation's Intranet. The Foundation did not implement any new or revised access to information-related policies, guidelines or procedures during the reporting period.

Proactive Publication

The Asia Pacific Foundation of Canada is a government institution as defined in section 3 of the *Access to Information Act* and for the purposes of Part 2 of the *Access to Information Act*. The Asia Pacific Foundation of Canada is not listed in Schedules I, I.1, II, or IV of the *Financial Administration Act*.



Access to Information Act - Statistical Report - Interpretation

Requests Received Under the Act:

APF Canada received one request under the *Access to Information Act* during the reporting period, which was completed within 61 to 120 days. 0 percent of the requests were completed in the legislated timeline. There are no active requests that are outstanding from previous reporting periods.

Complaints Received Under the Act:

There are no active complaints outstanding from previous reporting periods.

Consultations Received from Other Institutions and Organizations:

The Foundation received no consultation requests under the *Access to Information Act* from other institutions or organizations during the reporting period.

Extensions:

APF Canada invoked one extension pursuant to section 9(1)a, due to the search required to identify the requested records and their resulting interference with operations/workload.

Exemptions and Exclusions:

APF Canada invoked one exemption pursuant to section 19 (1) that the head of a government institution shall refuse to disclose any record requested under this Part that contains personal information. No exclusions were cited during the reporting period. 100 percent of completed requests were "disclosed in part."

Translations:

Translations were not requested during the reporting period.

Costs:

The cost of administering the *Access to Information Act* is estimated at \$3,703 for the reporting period.

Complaints, Audits, Investigations, and Federal Court Cases:

During the 2023-2024 year, no complaints were filed with the Office of the Information Commissioner, no audits or investigations were concluded, and no applications were submitted to the Federal Court or the Federal Court of Appeal.

Monitoring:

No monitoring of the time to process access to information requests was conducted during the reporting period.

Summary:

In the five years between 2019-2020 and 2023-2024, the Foundation received two requests under the *Access to Information Act* and five consultation requests from other federal institutions. One request (50%) was completed within 30 days, one exemption was invoked and no exclusions were cited.

In the previous five years, 2014-2015 to 2018-2019, the Foundation received six requests under the *Access to Information Act* and six consultation requests from other federal institutions. All requests (100%) were completed within 30 days, no exemptions were invoked and no exclusions were cited.

Privacy Act

Introduction

The purpose of the *Privacy Act* is to extend the present laws of Canada that protect the privacy of individuals with respect to personal information about themselves held by a government institution and that provide individuals with a right of access to that information.

Section 72 of the *Privacy Act* requires that the head of federal government institutions prepares and tables in Parliament an annual report of the administration of the Act for each fiscal year.

This annual report summarizes the activities of the Asia Pacific Foundation of Canada relating to the *Privacy Act* between April 1, 2023, and March 31, 2024, and is prepared in accordance with section 72 of the Act.

The Asia Pacific Foundation of Canada

The Asia Pacific Foundation of Canada, created by an Act of Parliament in 1984, is a not-for-profit organization focused on Canada's relations with Asia. Our mission is to be Canada's catalyst for engagement with Asia and Asia's bridge to Canada. APF Canada is dedicated to strengthening ties between Canada and Asia with a focus on expanding economic relations through trade, investment, and innovation; promoting Canada's expertise in offering solutions to Asia's climate change, energy, food security and natural resource management challenges; building Asia skills and competencies among Canadians, including young Canadians; and, improving Canadians' general understanding of Asia and its growing global influence.

The Foundation is based in Vancouver, B.C. and has 37 employees. The Foundation does not have any non-operational ("paper") subsidiaries to report on for this reporting period. Additional information on the Foundation and its activities can be found at www.asiapacific.ca.

Administration of Legislation

The Asia Pacific Foundation of Canada reports to the Minister of Foreign Affairs. The head of the Asia Pacific Foundation is the President and Chief Executive Officer.

Operational responsibility for the implementation of the *Privacy Act* at the Asia Pacific Foundation of Canada has been delegated to the Access to Information and Privacy (ATIP) Coordinator who reports to the Vice-President, Operations and Sponsorship, who in turn reports to the President and CEO. The ATIP Coordinator is the sole staff responsible for ATIP issues.

The Foundation did not participate in any service agreements under section 73.1 of the *Privacy Act* during the reporting period.

The ATIP Coordinator is responsible for the development and implementation of policies and procedures to manage the Foundation's compliance with the *Privacy Act*. The ATIP Coordinator is delegated full authority regarding the administration of, and compliance with, the *Privacy Act*. A copy of the Delegation Order is attached at the end of the report.

Training Activities

During the 2023-24 fiscal year the role and responsibilities of the ATIP Coordinator did not change. The ATIP Coordinator remains the same individual who occupied the position at the end of fiscal year 2022-23 and did not undertake any further ATIP related training.

The ATIP Coordinator did not organize any briefing sessions on the *Privacy Act* for new staff during the reporting period. (Number of participants: 0) We plan to conduct the appropriate training sessions for staff this Fall 2024.

The ATIP office has its ATIP information page on the Foundation's Intranet. It provides all employees with several information resources on the legislation, and policies and procedures relating to the *Privacy Act*.

Policies and Procedures

The Foundation has a comprehensive policies and procedures manual which provides specific procedures, standards and guidelines on processing requests under the *Privacy Act*. The manual is available to all staff on the Foundation's Intranet. The Foundation's Privacy Policy can be found on the Foundation's website. The Foundation did not implement any new or revised privacy-related policies, guidelines or procedures during the reporting period.

Initiatives and Projects to Improve Privacy

The Foundation's ATIP office continues using the ATIP Online Management Tool website to receive and process requests under the *Privacy Act*.
